

During the summer break, we were delighted to receive some exciting news! We had been nominated and shortlisted for the 'Best Primary School' category in the **Golden Apple awards**





2018. The awards ceremony took place on 5th October and was an inspirational evening. Unfortunately, it wasn't our turn to win, but it was a great achievement to be shortlisted to one of the three finalists. We would like to say thank you to our whole school community; parents, staff, governors, friends,

helpers and most of all our children, for making this possible.



Hard work has been ongoing throughout the holidays and our **Outdoor Area** looks even more fantastic now. Our trim trail and sports arena are complete and we are enjoying using our new



equipment in playtime, different lessons and for worship and quiet times.

The new term has got off to a flying start and we are very busy! We have welcomed new children into nursery, reception, year 3 and year 6 and we are enjoying getting to know our new friends. We have also welcomed a new teaching assistant and apprentice to our school team.

A **Candle Party Fundraiser** took place in school on Monday 24th September. This was well attended and raised £102 for our school PTA funds.



The whole school went on a trip to **Long Meg** to find out about the changes in our local area from the stone age to the iron age. This was a hands-on day, with lots of different tasks to learn more about the site, how it came to be there and what it might have been used for. We worked with a local archaeologist and teamed up

with the North Pennines AONB to find out more about the ancient site. The children did lots of measuring, detective work, discussing and team work. The beautiful blue sky helped all children and helpers to have a fantastic learning experience. We even had time to hide one of our Lees Hill School rocks!

We all had a super morning on Tuesday 2nd October working with volunteers from the **RSPB** to make bird boxes. They will look great around our school grounds and we are looking forward to watching them closely for visitors. Thanks to Bob, Pat and Christine for their help and sharing their passion for wildlife.



At the time of writing, we are in the midst of **RE Week**. The theme for this year is music and worship. We have learned some new hymns already, looked at the meaning behind the popular hymn 'Make me a Channel of your Peace' and we have even linked the theme to our Christmas card designs this year. Watch out for one coming your way this Christmas and you can see what a good job we have done!

We have four **After School Clubs** running. The themes this term are cookery, sport, art and STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths). Cookery club baked buns this week and the children will be preparing soup and bread for our soup share next week.

Our **Toddler Group** runs every Tuesday 9.30-11am in the school hall. This includes lots of play, snacks and a tea or coffee for grown-ups. First session free then 50p per family and children of all ages are welcome.

On a Thursday afternoon, we have **Gardening** time for as long as the weather permits. We are looking for more helpers to continue to make our garden space look beautiful and to widen the range of fruit and vegetables we grow. 
PARISH COUNCIL VACANCY
